April 15 marks the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic off the shores of Nova Scotia.

The Children's Dept will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic and the loss of so many of its passengers with a special book display this spring. Also, the third, fourth and fifth grade book groups will read stories and non-fiction about the event. A visitor will join the book groups to talk about her personal history as it relates to the Titanic. Mrs. Orian Greene is the great-granddaughter of Charles M. Hayes, who was lost on the Titanic, and his wife Clara who survived the event. Mrs. Greene will have stories and memorabilia to share with the children. Orian is a retired professor and Dean at Middlesex Community College.

The adult department will also feature and present screenings of *A Night to Remember* and *Titanic*.


YA Book Discussion Group Takes a Break


